THE COURT: Mr. Crowthers and Mr. Daku, I don't 5
profess to have any real knowledge or familiarity 6
with the area. I am aware, however, that the 7
Province of Saskatchewan has passed laws to allow 8
the - - the activity and accept the submissions 9
advanced by your counsel that it was simply as a 10
result of some confusion and lack of knowledge 11
that you didn't bring yourselves under that law to 12
be protected and that there was not a wilful or a 13
conscious attempt to break the law. 14

With that I - - I will follow the joint 15
submission and grant each of you a conditional 16
discharge and place you on probation for a period 17
of three months on the conditions that you keep 18
the peace and be of good behaviour, that you 19
report forthwith to the probation officer here in 20
Weyburn and therefore as directed by the probation 21
officer. That you reside in a residence approved 22
by the probation officer and not change it without 23
the prior written permission of the officer and 24
that prior to the conclusion of the three month 25
probation order and conditional sentence order 26

that each of you make a \$3,000 donation to a registered charity of your choice and file the receipt for that donation with the probation officer proving that payment. And just a moment -

MS. O'CONNOR: And that's a conditional discharge order and not a conditional sentence order, correct?

THE COURT: I'm sorry.

MS. O'CONNOR: It was a conditional discharge and not a conditional sentence order.

THE COURT: I - - I intended to say conditional discharge.

MS. O'CONNOR: At one point you said sentence and I just wanted to make it clear that this is not a jail sentence.

THE COURT: Oh. Let me very clear then, the sentence for both of your was a three month conditional discharge.

MS. O'CONNOR: Thank you.

THE COURT: And in light of the amount of the charitable donation and the dates on these matters, I will waive the criminal victim surcharge.

MR. PASHOVITZ: Thank you, your Honour.

THE COURT: Thank you.
